## **INTERIM DECISION**

These appeals against the August 19, 1997 decision of the Regional Water Manager, Mr. Hollingshead, allowing Alpex Development Corporation Ltd. to construct certain works, were heard together on October 15th and 16th, 1997. The "works" are required to address storm water flows from a large residential development proposed for lands immediately west of Mill Bay, B.C.

As certain necessary approvals for the development are being held up until the Panel's decision is rendered, the Panel is issuing an interim decision in the appeal with a full decision and detailed reasons to follow.

Neither Appellant has requested a rescission of the Regional Water Manager's decision dated August 19, 1997. The Board therefore upholds his decision

authorizing the works. However, the Panel will add certain terms and conditions to the original terms and conditions imposed by the Regional Water Manager. The additional terms and conditions will be specified in the full decision and detailed reasons which will follow this decision.

Accordingly, the terms and conditions contained within the Regional Water Manager's decision remain in full force and effect until such time as the Board's full decision is issued.
